We are holding two Fathers' Day Lunch Days where your child can invite one gentleman to lunch! To help the organisation of the lunches, they will be held on two separate days:


Thursday 9 June: Children with surname A-L Tuesday 14 June: Children with surname M-Z

# World Fair Trade Day 2016

Saturday 14 May 2016 is World Fair Trade day. As a rights respecting school it is important to teach our children about places in the world where children do not have their rights respected like they do. Fair Trade is a tangible contribution to the fight against poverty, climate change and global economic crises. The World Fair Trade Organization (WFTO) believes that trade must benefit the most vulnerable and deliver sustainable livelihoods by developing opportunities especially for small and disadvantaged producers. To celebrate we are holding a whole school art competition. Each child has been given a leaflet with information on how to enter. The prizes will include different Fair Trade products. #### Sun Tan Cream

Children do not bring sun screen to school for health and safety reasons e.g. younger children not being able to apply correctly and getting sun screen in their eyes or the possibility of an allergic reaction. Parents are asked to apply a suitable high factor sun cream to their child/children before the school day begins. This will provide adequate protection for the rest of the day. The school obviously monitors weather conditions, ensuring water is available and children being reminded to seek shady areas and wear sun caps when outside. Thank you for your support.



The children in Year 3 will be celebrating their First Holy Communion on two Saturdays; 11 and 18 June. Although this is a special day for Year 3, it is also an important school and parish event and we support the children by the choir from Years 4-6 singing at the Masses; in the same way they had been supported during their own First Holy Communion Mass.
