Holiday Requests During Term Time

Absence during term time as a result of term time holidays, interrupts continuity of teaching and learning and disrupts the educational progress of individual children. We actively discourage parents from arranging holidays during term time and will only authorise absence for such holidays in exceptional circumstances.

The Principal reserves the right to make individual judgements as to what constitutes exceptional circumstances, which might include the following:

- A parent or grandparent is seriously/terminally ill and the holiday proposed is likely to be the last such holiday;
- There has recently been a death or other significant trauma in the family and it is felt that an immediate holiday might help the child concerned better deal with the situation;
- The holiday is a unique one off never to be repeated occasion which can only take place at the time requested.

Clearly there are many situations which may constitute exceptional circumstances, but as a generality we should interpret 'exceptional' in this context as being of unique and significant emotional, educational or spiritual value to the child, which outweighs the loss of teaching time.

A child's previous attendance is also taken into consideration when judgements are made. Your support in doing your utmost to avoid term time holidays is appreciated.
