
Year 6 Leavers' Production and Party Tonight

We have had some queries about Internet sites, social networks and apps that the children are accessing at home. Parents are not always fully aware of the content of these or the minimum age that the children should be to access these sites. Did you know that anyone accessing Facebook, ooVoo, You Tube or Instagram should be 13 years old or older?

Just how well do you know and understand the social networks and apps that your children are using every day? Have you read the terms and conditions of each app? Is the apps age appropriate for your children? To support e-safety at home, we would like to highlight a website that you can use at home to find out this information. Visit <u>http://www.net-aware.org.uk/</u> to stay up to date and keep your child safe in today's digital world.

Net-Aware is a guide, primarily aimed at parents of 8-12 year olds, about the social networks, apps or games with an interactive element that children use most frequently. The purpose of the guide is to provide parents with the information they need to be able to keep their children safe online, to encourage parents to look for themselves and form their own views about the appropriateness of popular sites, and to give parents the confidence to facilitate balanced and informed conversations about what their children are doing online. It is based on other parents' experiences and the views of young people. Please do take the time to look at this site to support your child's e-safety education at home.
