

Pupil Premium Plan 2017-18

The Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) provides additional support for looked after children, children of service personnel and those from low income families (based on those registered for free school meals). Schools are free to spend the PPG as they see fit. The school recognises that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are registered or qualify for free school meals, therefore school reserves the right to allocate funding to any pupil or groups of pupils that have been identified as falling into this category.

Measuring the impact of 2017/2018 spending: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In Y6, all the PP children achieved at least the expected standard in Reading. Two out of the three Pupil Premium children achieved at least the expected standard in all areas with one achieving achieved higher scaled scores than the national average in two areas and one in all areas. • The Pupil Premium child in Y1 children achieved the national standard in the Phonics Screening test. • In Y2 both Pupil Premium children achieved national expectation in Maths, Reading and Writing. • Pupils with behavioural emotional needs benefitted from advice and support which resulted in them having greater focus and concentration in lessons. • Children attended residential trips and educational school trips.
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
