Mothers' Day Lunches 2019

Tuesday 19 March (Children with surname A-I), Wednesday 20 March (Children with surname J-R) and Tuesday 26 March 2019 (Children with surname S-Z).

We are holding three Mothers' Day Lunch Days where your child can invite one lady to lunch! This can be mothers, grandmothers, aunties or a family friend.

If your child normally has sandwiches but would like a school meal that day the cost is £2.15, adult meals are £3.80 per person. We are only able to accommodate one lady per family. If your child is in KS1 and normally has sandwiches you will need to order a child's meal but no payment is required due to the universal free school meal entitlement. Please contact the school office to order a meal.

Lunch will be served from 12:00pm - 1:00pm and guests are requested to arrive at 11.45am; entering the school through the Key Stage 1 entrance. Please note due to lack of space in the school hall and the popularity of this event no other children are allowed.

If you wish to join us please log into your Parent Pay account and to make a payment (£3.80 for adult meal and £2.15 if your child is in KS2 and usually has sandwiches). Please ensure you complete notes section; stating how many adult meals you have ordered and how many meals if your child has sandwiches. If your child has school meals every day, please pay for their meal in the normal way and just order the appropriate additional adult meal.

If you are unable to attend on your allocated date; please send a letter into the school office for an alternative day.

The deadline for ordering and paying for meals is Tuesday 5 March; We do not want anyone to miss out but as food needs to be ordered in advance, no late orders can be accepted after this date.



Attendance - Our school strives for 100% attendance.

Government legislation states that a child with an attendance of 90% and below is categorised as a "Persistent Absence Pupil". An attendance figure of 90% equates to missing half a day every week that means four weeks of missed school work across the whole year.

Parents should also be aware that referrals to the school nurse will be considered for those children with an attendance rate of below 95% due to health related absences.

The Punctuality Award for the week: EYFS, Year 3, Year 5 and Year 6.




