Health and Safety/Safeguarding

I have been made aware of a recent report in the press regarding an incident involving some pupils from Holy Cross whilst walking home from school. Unfortunately the report is not factually correct and therefore very unhelpful. There was an incident involving a small group of our pupils and two pupils from a local Secondary School. As a school, we are committed to the safeguarding of all children and we have worked closely with the pupils and parents concerned and the other school to identify the facts and the other pupils involved. Fairfax Secondary School has been very thorough and rigorous in both taking the issue very seriously and in its response to the concern. I thank them for their commitment in working together to resolving this issue; strong partnerships are essential for effective safeguarding which is why the news report is so disappointing. The correct avenue for sharing any concern is through the school and I hope that all parents cooperate with this in the future. Thank you for your support.

Sun glasses

As the weather has really improved over the last week, there have been a growing number of children wearing sunglasses to school. Recently, a child fell over in the playground whilst wearing sunglasses and cut himself badly. After taking advice, it has been decided that for health and safety reasons, children will not be allowed to wear sunglasses at playtime and therefore I ask children, wherever possible, not to bring sunglasses to school. There is plenty of shade provided during playtimes; including the wooden sheds for KS2 generously provided by the PTA last academic year to support this. If there is a medical reason which needs to be considered, for example, medication being taken for severe hay fever, then please contact me via the school office. Thank you for your support.
